Dear Friend,

Yes, it's only a month or so that you received the previous newsletter, but with the long-awaited trip to Horb now concluded and with the Summer Social on our doorstep we feel another one is due!

Haslemere went to Horb

We left Haslemere for LHR last **Wednesday 29th May** and flew to Stuttgart from where we enjoyed a coach ride south to Horb am Neckar. Our five days just got better and better with the daily temperature climbing from 22 to 30 degrees by the time we left. Horb nestles between two ranges of hills (left-hand picture below) and has many characteristics in common with Haslemere. One thing both towns share is a huge problem of traffic. At present, a vast number of large lorries descends the hills on one side of Horb to cross the river in the middle of the town, to then climb out the other side. The solution to this problem has taken about as long to plan as did the Hindhead Tunnel. Horb's solution, which will be funded from Berlin, is a three lane flyover (right-hand picture). Work has already begun on the support structures on the south side and it is hoped that it will be ready to receive traffic in about five years.





One of the highlights of our visit was a concert staged in the recently renovated church which brought together singers and musicians from Haslemere and Horb. It was a fabulous night out and the performers justifiably earned themselves a standing ovation.
